<u>Sept. 15</u>

01:02 AM – Recovered License Plates

Officer conducting area check located a suspicious vehicle parked in an apartment complex parking lot. The vehicle had stolen Washington license plates out of Renton on it, which were later recovered by the officer.

01:02 AM – Stolen License Plates

This event is associated with the above incident, in which after the stolen license plates were recovered. The officer located the vehicle owner who did not realize that their license plates had been stolen and swapped with other stolen license plates. The owner of the vehicle was unsure when this could've happened.
